


Sunday 12 February 2017 II a.m.

World Day of Prayer Service:



No lettuce!

Don't worry, make a nice winter coleslaw from local ingredients: cabbage and carrots with optional onion, apple or raisins. Just shred cabbage finely, grate carrots and any other ingredients and add your favourite dressing. Delicious and crunchy and keeps well in fridge. If using apple, add a little lemon juice to stop discolouration.
