Value of our church and congregation.

The working time for all the congregation, who have to be patient, relying on hope and trust, whilst maintaining the unity we need to fulfil our mission to church and community. The Worship Task Group recognises this, and would like to create an opportunity for everyone to feel involved in the process of finding our new minister, by making time to "Pause for Prayer" during the first week in Advent. The church will be open from 6.00 - 6.30pm from Monday 3rd to Friday 7th December (inclusive) so that anyone who wishes can come to the church for a time of quiet prayer and contemplation. At 6.00pm there will be a short prayer of Approach to God, followed by a quiet, contemplative time of about twenty minutes, enabling a pause in the busy round of life, when those present can pray for the future of our church and congregation.

During the service of words and music on 23rd December, members of the congregation will be invited to make paper chains to decorate our Christmas tree. The beautifully decorated paper links are handmade by a cooperative in Nepal, which is one of the world's poorest countries, where girls and women are particularly disadvantaged. Traidcraft's partner agency in Nepal (GPI), has started a programme for teenage girls and women who have been or are at risk of being trafficked and are providing training and an alternative employment to prostitution. Our paper chains will be more than just paper chains: they will be a reminder of the links between us and these Nepalese women and will help to transform lives by breaking the chains of injustice.

The offerings from the **Christmas Services** will be donated to two charities: **Traidcraft**, for the project in Nepal, and **Instant Neighbour**. Recently the Guild had a talk on the very important work which Instant Neighbour does for vulnerable and disadvantaged families in our city. We are aware from Aberdeen Presbytery and from the media of the need for more assistance at a time when many families are experiencing real financial difficulties. Our generosity can make a real difference to those for whom Christmas might otherwise be a struggle.

Advent is an incredible season, often overlooked in the rush to Christmas. Advent is a gift – a time to prepare, and a time to wait in anticipation of the arrival of the Christ child. Of course, Advent is multi-layered. We prepare and wait not simply for the celebration of ancient history, but we look forward in the present for the arrival among us of God, in our community of Ferryhill, and in the streets of our city.

Christmas is an annual reminder of the light that is Jesus Christ, and the difference his way of living can make in the darkness of the world. And still Christ comes today to us his people, whoever we are, whatever our life circumstances.
